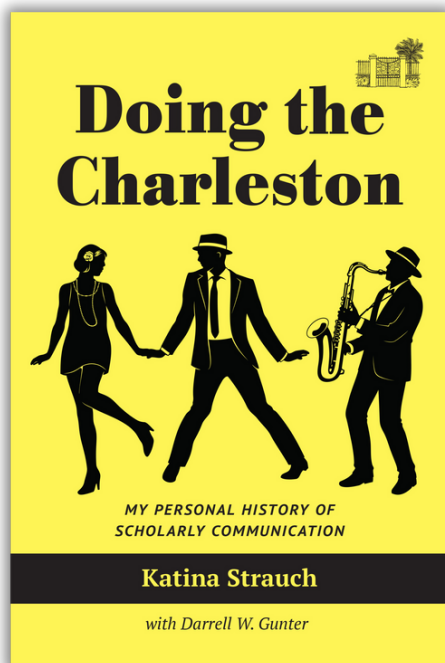




# DOING THE CHARLESTON

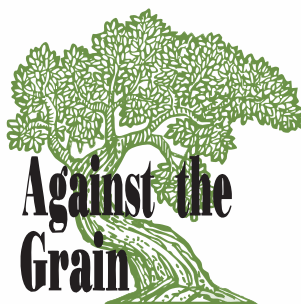
