Respectable Iranian decision makers, I understand some plans are brewing and hope you adjoin to discuss your proposal and decide your immediate steps.

 CLASSIFICATION- TOP SECRET
 Respectable President and dear friends:
 I have recently had the opportunity to confer with the our Supreme Leader and he has expressed his consent to Iran conducting secret, direct negotiations with Israel without the involvement of any other state or organization. The proposal would be as follows:
 1. Israel will not interfere with or harm the development of Iran's nuclear program in any way.
 2. Israel agrees to recognize an independent Palestinian State, with its capital in Jerusalem (Fallback position - Jerusalem would be under UN administration and also be the capital of Israel).
 3. Israel will publicly admit that it possesses nuclear weapons and will issue a "no first nuclear strike" pledge.
 4. Iran recognizes the State of Israel based on the pre-1967 borders (Fallback position - borders to be determined by the International Court of Justice subject to mutual agreement on terms of reference).
 5. Iran will issue a "no first strike pledge" in the event of obtaining nuclear weapons in the future.
 6. Iran will cease providing financial support to Hamas (We have already basically indicated our intention to do this, so this would be just a confirmation. The Sunni Arab countries can fund Hamas).
 7. Both parties will issue a strong condemnation of any plans for military intervention in the Middle East by any third parties (Fallback position - limit this to intervention in Iran or Israel).
 8. This agreement is conditional on the current sanctions against Iran being discontinued, and the parties will jointly request that this occur.
 9. The negotiations concerning this agreement are to be conducted completely in secret and neither party will consult with any third party while they are in progress.
 Please let me know what you think of this proposal. If you are agreeable, I will approach Israel as soon as possible, so that we can formulate a public response prior to Feb. 28th, when the multi-party negotiations are scheduled to resume.

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

 Yes, good point. I will delete the reference to Jerusalem from # 2. We can always propose a compromise clause later where Jerusalem is administered by the UN as a joint capital if they raise it as an issue. In terms of bargaining strategy, we can suggest to Israel that it is better for them to deal directly with us, since there is a danger that the US might sell them out on the Palestinian issue in order to gain the support of Arab states in opposing Iran's nuclear program. There is some evidence in the WikiLeaks diplomatic cables from Bahrain etc. that suggest this. Do you have any suggestions as to whom on the Israeli team I should send the proposed agreement?
